### **How to access NHS 24 services**

NHS 24 have introduced a new 'Ask NHS inform a question' chat bot on NHS inform. This lets users ask questions about COVID-19 content directly on the website (the tool is available here <https://ask.nhsinform.scot/>). An SMS service (based on the chat bot) will be launched at a later date.

People who call the COVID-19 helpline (on 0800 028 2816) can choose to switch to webchat. If they do this, they receive text message and can start the chat from there.

The new 'NHS 24 COVID' app is now available to download from the App store and Google Play Store. This provides access to the NHS inform COVID information as well as the self-help guide so users can assess their potential COVID symptoms, with the ability to call in direct to the 111 COVID service if that's the appropriate route for them.

The [Relay UK](#) service provides a centralised relay service for people who are deaf and without speech. This can be accessed by the app or by text phone. Of note, the operators also answer 999 emergency calls. You can call NHS 24's 111 service (18001 111) or NHS inform (18001 0800 22 44 88) or for Emergency 999 calls the number is 18000, using this relay service.

[contactSCOTLAND –BSL](#) service can be accessed by people who are Deaf or deafblind and use BSL. The contactSCOTLAND-BSL staff are fully aware of NHS 24 services, including the COVID-19 helpline (The [NHS 111 British Sign Language \(BSL\) interpreter service](#) is available in England and Wales).

### **What to do if you have symptoms of COVID-19**

If you've developed a new, continuous cough and/or a fever/high temperature in the last 7 days, stay at home for 7 days from the start of your symptoms, even if you think your symptoms are mild. Do not go to your GP, pharmacy or hospital.

You should phone 111 if:

- your symptoms worsen during home isolation, especially if you're in a high or extremely high risk group

- breathlessness develops or worsens, particularly if you're in a high or extremely high risk group
- your symptoms haven't improved in 7 days
- If you have a medical emergency, phone 999 and tell them you have COVID-19 symptoms.
